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STI Prevention Methods Coming Soon

Gonorrhoea Vaccine

We are proud to be among the first to offer the new gonorrhoea vaccine, helping to protect communities in Suffolk. The 4CmenB vaccination program will be available to those most at risk of infection, this includes gay and bisexual men, men that have sex with men, or people that have unprotected sex with multiple partners. This is now available at Suffolk Sexual Health Service and consultations can be booked using the [online portal](#) or by calling 0300 303 9982.

Doxycycline

Another prevention method due to be coming to clinics soon is DoxyPEP. DoxyPEP involves taking two 100mg tablets of an antibiotic called Doxycycline. The pills should be taken within 72hours after sex. Studies show that the medicine reduces the chance of getting chlamydia and syphilis by around 80%. [Learn more about DoxyPEP here.](#)

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)

Suffolk Sexual Health Service and Essex Sexual Health Service are working with ‘The Two Johns’, online child sexual exploitation experts, as part of Sexual Health Week 2025, with this year’s theme being ‘Chronically Online’. The Two Johns will lead the session, opening your eyes to a world that we, as adults, didn’t grow up in. The session aims to make sure you are aware of the dangers, know the signs, and explore what you can do to help keep your child safe. The session will also cover an overview of local sexual health services, support available, and how these can be accessed by young people, as well as signposting parents and carers to platforms to support them to have conversations with their young people around healthy relationships and sexual health.

New RSHE Guidance

The government has released new statutory guidance on relationships and sexual health education, to be implemented by September 2026. The updated framework strengthens teaching on online harms, sexual harassment, mental health, and respectful relationships.
